

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

The Siskiyou County Board of Supervisors will hold a Public Hearing on Tuesday, July 3, 2018, at 1:30PM, in the Board of Supervisors' Chambers, Siskiyou County Courthouse, 311 Fourth Street, Yreka, California on the following item:

Siskiyou County Community Development Environmental Health Division Onsite Wastewater Treatment Local Agency Management Program (LAMP)

The Siskiyou County Environmental Health Division is conducting the second public review and comment of the draft LAMP document. Upon completion of the review process a final LAMP document will be presented for the Board of Supervisors for approval to submit to the LAMP to the North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board for State approval.

The Siskiyou County Environmental Health Department (SCEH) is responsible for regulating On-site Waste Water Treatment Systems (OWTS) (on-site septic systems) throughout the incorporated and unincorporated areas of the County. SCEH operates its onsite wastewater treatment program under the authority granted by the State Regional Water Quality Control Board.

This draft LAMP has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) Water Quality Control Policy for the siting, design, operation and maintenance of onsite wastewater treatment systems.

Draft LAMP will be available in the Environmental Health Division office for public review June 19, 2018. Please contact the Environmental Health Division at (530) 841-2100 if you have any questions regarding the draft document.

All interested persons are invited to be present and be heard thereon or present comments in writing to the Board of Supervisors, 510 North Main Street, Yreka, CA 96097. All items presented to the Board of Supervisors during a public hearing, including but not limited to, letters, email, petitions, photos, or maps, become a permanent part of the record and must be submitted to the Clerk of the Board. It is advised that the presenter bring 7 copies of anything presented to the Board and that the presenter create copies in advance for their own records.

If you challenge the proposed action in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors prior to or at the public hearing.
