RECYCLING MAKES A DIFFERENCE

What is California Refund Value?

California Refund Value (CRV) is the amount paid by consumers at the checkout stand and paid back to consumers when they recycle eligible aluminum, plastic, glass and bi-metal beverage containers at certified recycling centers.

Containers will have a label saying "CA Redemption Value" or "CA Cash Refund."

How much will I get paid?

Recycling markets can change very rapidly. As a matter of convenience and efficiency, most recycling centers pay by the pound when consumers bring in a large load of recyclable containers. However, consumers may request to be paid per container if they redeem 50 or fewer containers per material type.

The minimum refund value established for each type of eligible beverage container is 5 cents for each container under 24 ounces and 10 cents for each container 24 ounces or greater.

How much can I bring?

Effective Jan. 1 2014, certified recycling centers in CA are restricted by law from receiving loads in excess of 100 lbs. of aluminum or plastic beverage containers or 1,000 lbs. of glass beverage containers per day.

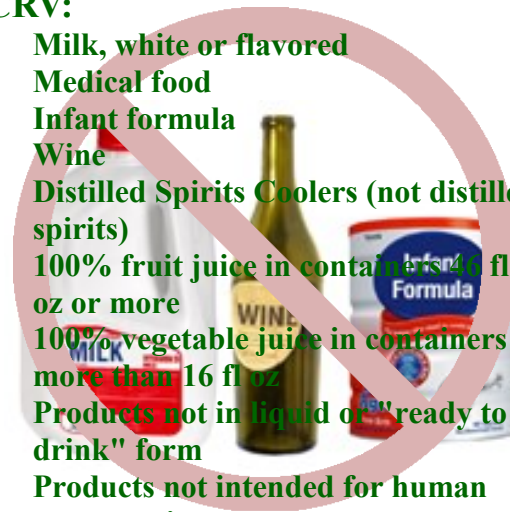
Containers accepted for CRV:

- Beer
- Fruit drinks
- Sport drinks
- Wine coolers
- Coffee drinks
- Tea Drinks
- Carbonated soft drinks
- Distilled spirit coolers
- Carbonated and mineral water
- Non-carbonated water
- Non-carbonated soft drinks
- Fruit juice in containers less than 46 oz.
- Vegetable juice in containers 16 oz. or less



Containers NOT accepted for CRV:

- Milk, white or flavored
- Medical food
- Infant formula
- Wine
- Distilled Spirits Coolers (not distilled spirits)
- 100% fruit juice in containers 46 fl oz or more
- 100% vegetable juice in containers more than 16 fl oz
- Products not in liquid or "ready to drink" form
- Products not intended for human consumption
- Containers not made of glass, metal,



Aluminum Cans

Flattening the cans is not necessary, but they should be clean and dry. No tin cans, foil, or pie plates.

Glass

All glass food and beverage containers should be rinsed and have the lids removed. It is not necessary to remove the labels. No cookware, window glass, ceramic, or mirrors.

Plastic Containers

All plastic containers marked #1 PETE and #2 HDPE are recyclable. Containers marked #3 through #7 are recyclable but not always in your area. Check with your local recycling center first.

Remember:

Loads contaminated with dirt, moisture, or garbage will receive a reduction in the price paid.

Can I recycle cardboard?

Cardboard can be recycled at Yreka Transfer Recycling, Oberlin Road Transfer Station, and the Black Butte Transfer Station for free.

1. Clean, dry, corrugated cardboard only.
2. All Cardboard must be broken down completely flat.
3. No Styrofoam or plastic in boxes, no wax or slick-surfaced cardboard. No food boxes, cereal boxes, paper, or trash.
