

SISKIYOU COUNTY ANIMAL CONTROL SHELTER ANIMAL VISITATION POLICY

The Siskiyou County Animal Control Department's Animal Care Shelter houses animals of unknown origin and history, animals quarantined and/or impounded and abandoned/ready for adoption animals.

The public is welcome in the lobby area of the Shelter during posted business hours. Non-business hour visits from the public will be assessed and scheduled on a case by case basis and by appointment only.

People from the public wanting to adopt an animal are welcome to look at the animals for adoption on the adoption board in the lobby. If interested in meeting the animal the Shelter Technician, Animal Control Officer or designated escort may grant a supervised visit of the animal. The interested party must agree to the following shelter kennel visitation rules:

ANIMAL VISITATION RULES

YOU MUST FOLLOW ALL INSTRUCTIONS GIVEN BY YOUR ESCORT.

1. DO NOT TOUCH AND OR POKE FINGERS INTO RED AND YELLOW LABELED KENNELS. IF CHILDREN ARE WITH YOU, PLEASE HOLD THEIR HAND.
2. YOU MUST FOLLOW ALL DISEASE PREVENTION MEASURES WHEN DIRECTED TO AND/OR POSTED.
3. PLEASE DO NOT GIVE ANY FOOD/SNACKS OR "TOYS" TO THE ANIMALS.
4. PHOTOS AND/OR VIDEOS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO BE TAKEN IN THE SHELTER.
5. PLEASE STAY WITH THE GROUP AND WITH YOUR ESCORT.

IF YOU DO NOT AGREE WITH THE ABOVE RULES YOU ARE NOT WELCOME BEYOND THE LOBBY AREA.

All animals housed in the Shelter kennel pending administrative hearings, court proceedings or are under quarantine will not have visitors. All owners of such animals described in the previous sentence will be denied access/visitation to the animal until the completion of the pending action. If conditions have been placed on the owner and/or animal then the conditions must be completed prior to visitation or release of the animal to the owner.
